To all that this may concern:

On August 3rd, 2009 while at The Supervisor of Elections, office I spoke with Mrs. Ida Elliott who is the Supervisor of Elections, about a matter that came to me from one of my supporters. It was suggested to me that I check into the matter of Commissioner Webb's IN, THEN OUT, THEN IN AGAIN, for the upcoming election. I asked Mrs. Elliott was it legal for Commissioner Webb to re-enter the race after the closing. Mrs. Elliott stated to me that she had called Tallahassee and they said NO, she could not re-enter. Mrs. Elliott also stated to me that she had received a call from the City of Apalachicola's Administrator, Mrs. Betty Taylor-Webb telling her to put Commissioner Webb's name back on the ballot. Mrs. Elliott stated to me that she had received a letter of withdrawal from Commissioner Webb on Friday, July 24th, and after receiving the letter of withdrawal had sent in her paperwork to the printers without Commissioner Webb's name on the ballot.

I, Anderson Williams, after leaving the Supervisor of Elections office, placed a call to Mayor Van Johnson and he did not answer his phone. I then spoke with Ms. Brenda Ash who is also a candidate for commission seat #4. I asked Ms. Ash if she was aware of the situation with Commissioner Webb entering, withdrawing, and re-entering the race. Ms. Ash stated to me that she was aware and someone had already mentioned to her that she should call The Attorney Generals Office.

I then went to City Hall and spoke with the City Administrator, Mrs. Betty Taylor-Webb. I asked her who's decision was it to place Commissioner Webb's name back on the ballot. Mrs. Taylor-Webb stated to me that it was no one's decision that Commissioner Webb could re-enter after her withdrawal on Friday, July 24th, and that the material had not been sent to the printers. Mrs. Taylor-Webb stated that I should speak with the city's attorney Mr. Pat Floyd.

Please note that according to The Supervisor of Elections, Mrs. Ida Elliott, when she called Tallahassee, she was told that Commissioner Webb's name could not go back on the ballot. Also please note that contrary to what Mrs. Taylor-Webb stated to me concerning the material not being sent to the printers, The Supervisor of Elections; Mrs. Elliott stated that her material had already been sent to the printers.

It is my greatest hope that **you**, The City of Apalachicola's Elected Officials, would correct this matter **at this level IMMEDIATELY!**
